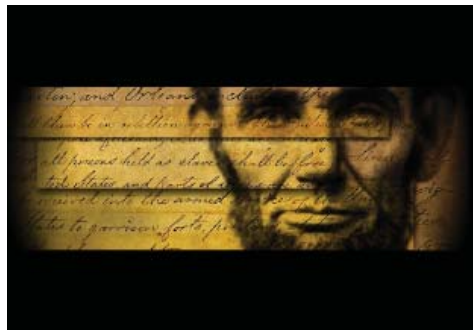

CYCLORAMA, FILM AND MUSEUM EXPERIENCE



The Morgan Freeman-narrated film **A New Birth of Freedom** will orient your group to the Battle of Gettysburg and the American Civil War. After the film, ascend the escalator to see the massive “Battle of Gettysburg” Cyclorama painting—this original 1884 work of art is larger than a football field and combines with an overhead canopy and a three-dimensional diorama to surround your group with a Victorian illusion—visitors feel as though they are on the fields of Pickett’s Charge on the third day of battle. And don’t miss the Gettysburg Museum of the American Civil War, where the story of the Battle and the war is told through 12 galleries and includes artifacts, interactive exhibits and additional films.

DAVID WILLS HOUSE

President Abraham Lincoln stayed with the Wills family the night before his famous address. Today, the Wills House is a place to learn about the Gettysburg Address, the town and the battle’s effect on Gettysburg’s citizens.

POLICIES FOR STUDENT GROUPS

(Please note that we reserve the right to refuse entry to those who fail to comply with these policies.)

THIS IS THE PLACE where 51,000 Americans became casualties as they fought for their beliefs, displaying amazing acts of strength and bravery. **THIS IS THE PLACE** where your group can walk in the footsteps of these courageous soldiers and leaders and come to understand Gettysburg's important place in our nation's history. We ask that your group **RESPECT THIS HALLOWED GROUND** by observing the following:

1. Please **disembark** from your bus **ONLY** when instructed by a member of the Gettysburg Foundation's Visitor Services staff.
2. Our **chaperone-to-student ratio is 1:7**, meaning that one chaperone is required for every seven students. It is vital that chaperones/teachers **remain with their students/children at ALL times**. No students will be admitted to any venue without his or her accompanying chaperone. Chaperones are responsible for maintaining orderly and respectful behavior.
3. Please **show courtesy and respect** for other people and the importance of this battlefield.
Specifically:
 - Speak quietly, even in large open areas
 - Do not talk during films or presentations
 - Do not run, jump or behave loudly
 - Do not be a distraction to fellow visitors/groups
 - Do not touch or climb on displays or exhibits; use interactives only as intended.
 - Do not take more brochures than are needed, and please allow only chaperones/teachers to select brochures.
4. Leave backpacks on your bus. **Backpacks are not permitted** in the Museum and Visitor Center.
5. **Food, drinks and chewing gum are not permitted** in the Museum or in the film theaters or the Cyclorama gallery.
6. **Flash photography and laser pointers are not permitted** in the Museum or in the film theaters or the Cyclorama gallery. Flash photography has a detrimental effect on the artifacts over time.
7. Please **assemble your group** at the theater entrance **at least 10 minutes before** your scheduled Cyclorama and Film show time. We cannot accommodate late arrivals.
8. Please **know the breakdown and number in your group** and have one chaperone identify your group members when you check in. Please remain together and proceed quietly, as instructed by the Visitor Services staff.
9. If your group is expected to take notes, be sure they have the proper materials. **Students are not to lean on or use walls and display cabinets as desktops.**
